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A message from the Principal

As my first year as the 5th Principal and as a first time Principal, I could not have asked for a more caring and supportive school to commence my leadership journey. I felt warmly welcomed by staff and students and have been overwhelmed by the support and enthusiasm that I have received from many in the community.

All new Principals inevitably bring 'change' to a school with the goal of improving outcomes for young people. I was asked earlier in the year what my vision was for young people and if I was to attempt to articulate it, "I want confident young people who enjoy coming to school, continuously learning, give of their best to all they do and who do not limit their horizons because they doubt themselves, are not afraid to speak up about their opinions and concerns but do so in a respectful manner". This requires an environment where teachers set high standards, show compassion and understanding, an environment that is fair and where teachers continually try to improve their own teaching practices.

The year started off with adjusting a few school rules such as permitting coloured runners as long as they were trainers, long hair for boys, sleepers for girls, the introduction of an EFTPOS machine in the canteen and a whole school cross country event for the first time and year 6s at our Batavia games. Meeting with all staff and year 12 students at the start of the year gave me a good feel for the school and where our students had placed their hopes and aspirations. Staff continued their professional development training based on Dylan William's assessment for learning framework. Physically we commenced the installation of our new basketball courts for Primary and Secondary. The Fete was a wonderful day and the staff, students and parents raised enough money for our new elegant, beautiful, remote controlled school gates which have been an exciting addition to the entrance of the school.

Relay for Life

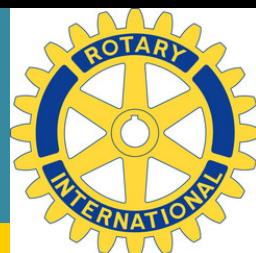


This year the Relay for Life team raised over \$2000 to help support cancer patients and carers in the Midwest.
