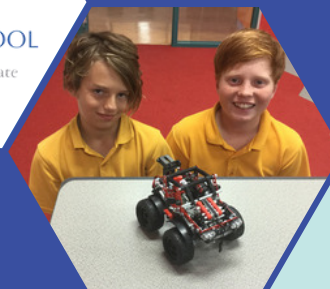

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Students, Parents and Fellow Members of our School Community,

2017 has been the most successful year in the school's history according to benchmarks such as academics, service, sport and music. In my last year as Geraldton Grammar School Principal, I could not be more proud of my students' achievements and my dedicated teachers and support staff.

Academic Achievements

1st MidWest Regional Debating Champions for the second year running.

1st in state - ICAS Science Medal Winner - top science student in the state in year 6

High distinction winners in ICAS English and Science tests

State representatives in two national science schools

Five local writing awards - Randolph Stow Young Writers Awards

The school is placed at or above national rankings in 16 of the 20 testing parameters at NAPLAN for the 3rd consecutive year. These collective results place our school as the top academic school in the MidWest again this year.

Vocational Education Achievements

I am extremely proud all my students who have chosen the vocational pathways. Ben Rowe was named as the WA School-based Apprentice of the Year. This is the top award in the state. This result builds on student results from last year which indicated that our students were the top certificate II and III student at Central Regional TAFE. In 2017 one hundred percent of our students completed their certificate courses across more than seven courses. I wish to thank the course providers and my staff for supporting students in after-school tutorial programs that have allowed Grammar students the flexibility to access such a varied curriculum.

Sporting Achievements

In 2017, our sporting teams have excelled. Our Primary School Interschool teams have placed first in the MidWest in swimming, cross country, and AFL. Our Middle and Senior School teams have delivered eight premierships in local and country week carnivals this year across the following sports: AFL, Hockey, Netball, Soccer, Badminton and Basketball. Our boys also excelled in the ACC Swimming Championships placing second. I congratulate our athletes, their respective coaches and sports teachers for their commitment to excellence.

Musical Achievements

Our growing music program is the envy of the MidWest, and our performers excelled again this year. We placed first at the Geraldton Music Festival in the following categories: Concert Band, Secondary Choir, Rock Band, Saxophone Ensemble, year 1/2 Choir, year 5/6 Choir, year 3/4 Percussion, and year 3/4 Choral Speaking. Our performers placed second in year 3/4 Choir and year 3/4 Recorder at the same festival. The Middle and Senior School Choir was also invited to perform on stage at the Queens Park Theatre with The Voice winner Harrison Craig. 2017 is our most successful year in music in our history. Thank you to Miss Kaur, Ms Tonkin and Mr Sloan for their commitment to the school's various music programs.



Service Learning Initiatives

The school has contributed greatly to local, national and international service initiatives this year. I have been particularly proud of our new Interact Club. This club has been sponsored by the Batavia Coast Rotary Club and has raised funds for a ShelterBox, donated winter woollies to the hospital, raised funds for Relay for Life, the Geraldton Food Bank and our sister school in Nepal.

So I need to record my own acknowledgement and thanks to all Board members for the work that they have done, are doing and will do in moving our School into its next phase of development. In particular to Paula Purcher (deputy chair) for the direct support she has shown me.

The senior management team and in particular Mr Graeme Munday for his executive support to the Board and also Mr Derek Lange for his help too. The Board acknowledges and thanks all staff at the School for their work, care and diligence

To Mr Nick Johnstone, the Board wishes him well in his future endeavours and thanks him for the work and consideration that he has shown during his tenure as Principal. He will leave a lasting impression on our School.

The changes in personnel are significant and indeed the Board congratulates the recently new executive elected to the P&F. We look forward to working together for the good of the School.

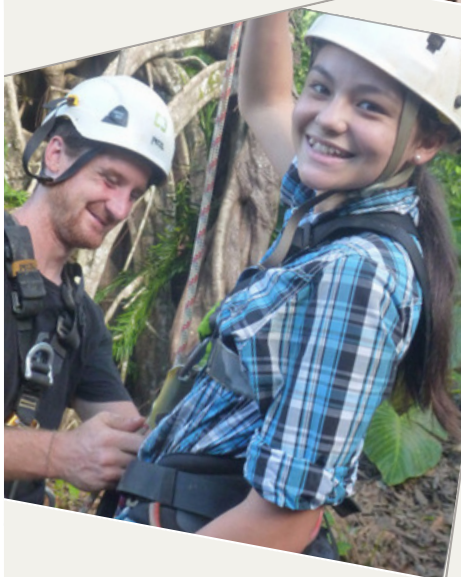


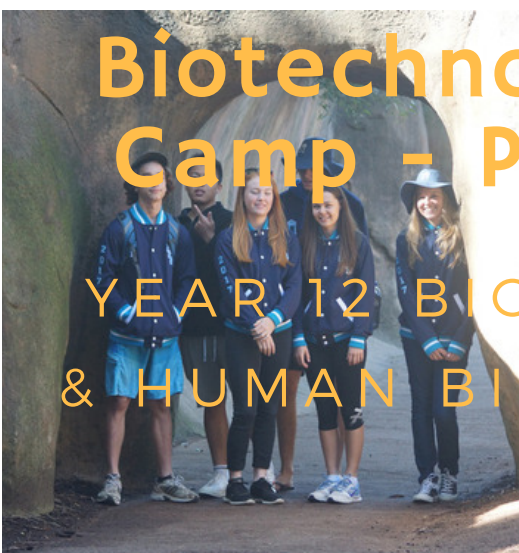
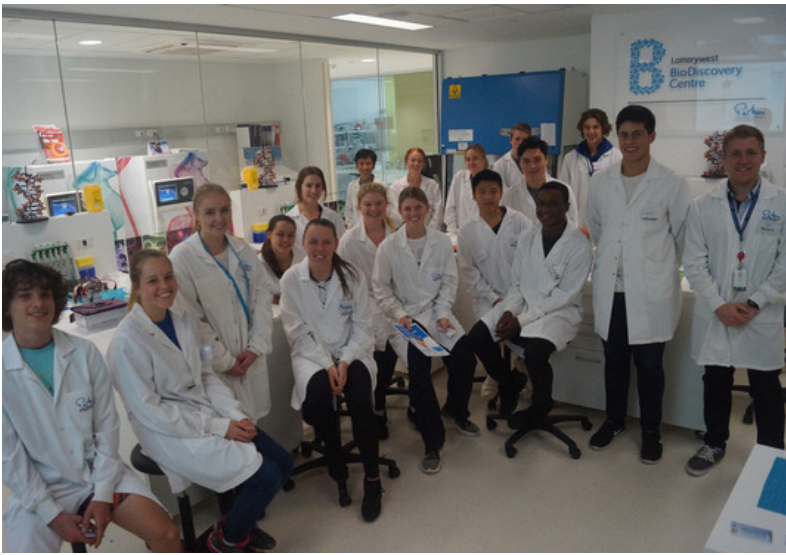


Operation Wallacea Indonesia Expedition
